

With the holidays fast approaching we have several popular vendor sales on the calendar to finish out 2023.

We have had a very successful fall season highlighted by the addition of Frederick Health Village as an additional site for vendor sales. With the inclusion of the staff working at the Village location vendor sales have enjoyed an increase in both sales traffic and volume. We recently concluded vendor sales by D&D Jewelry Designs, Mindy's Jewels, MMG Gifts (formerly Collective Goods), \$7 Everything Sale and Silver Events.

We will be closing the year with an exciting slate of vendor sales starting in November with Mindy's Jewels and Lancaster Linens and concluding in late December with MMG Gifts and Fudge Farm.

Looking ahead to 2024 we have a full schedule of sales with eight (8) vendors visiting Frederick at both locations. We have added a new vendor Uniform Village from Cumberland, Maryland that will be offering a full variety of uniforms for the staff.

Vendor sales are very popular with the hospital staff and provide them the opportunity to purchase reasonably priced goods without leaving work, a source of funds for the Auxiliary and a unique opportunity for volunteers to meet and interact with hospital staff. Vendor sales have payroll deduction which requires volunteers to work the sales and complete the sales transactions that are payroll deductions. We have a new Quick Charge System that is very easy to operate and makes processing payroll sales simple. Shifts are 2 ½ to 3 hours, so if you have a few hours, want to meet and interact with our wonderful and dedicated staff while helping to raise funds for the Auxiliary come and join the fundraising team. At the same time you will have first crack at the wide variety of unique items offered for sale by our vendors.

Over the past five years, Bert has been working an average of 8-12 hours per week at multiple jobs/assignments throughout the hospital – the Information Desk, NICU Cuddler, Select Seconds, Sewing Group, Patient Folders, and Medical Records. A skilled crocheter, Bert also finds time to crochet newborn baby hats for the hospital at home. Since May 2018 Bert has accumulated a total of 3,295.75 service hours.

"The best part of my volunteer experience is the satisfaction and gratification that I receive from helping the hospital staff, patients, and visitors," said Bert with a grin.

Besides volunteering at the hospital, Bert is an active member of the Frederick County Senior Recreation Council where she meets with people, goes on hikes and exercises regularly.

"We need interactions with people to stay alert and vital," said Bert excitedly. This is another reason why Bert has been such a dedicated volunteer who is so deeply involved in her work at the hospital. Joyce Weddle walked into the hospital and signed up as a volunteer the next day after she was retired from her government job in 1999. Simple as it is!

Living in Harpers Ferry, WV, Joyce travels 60, sometimes 80-90 miles round trip, depending on the road conditions, to come to volunteer at the hospital. Her job at the WINGS mainly involves helping discharge patients including babies and run errands throughout the hospital, and she has been doing this same job for over 24 years!


