President's Message

Greetings to all of you! As we enter our 7th week of quarantine, I hope each of you and your loved ones are healthy and safe. I am sure everyone is a bit tired of being inside and one day this will all be a wonderful – if not strange – memory. For now, the Auxiliary Board wanted to send out a special edition of the Stethoscope to update you on some events and items that have had to be changed or canceled due to our current state of emergency. Among others, this includes the annual Fashion Show, the annual picnic, and the membership meeting.

It seems so strange at the hospital and at the off campus locations without you! It is so different to go into the hospital and not be greeted by the wonderful Auxiliary volunteers. Your absence is very noticeable, and many of the hospital leadership and the medical staff have expressed that you are sorely missed.

The hospital has made several changes to accommodate COVID-19 patients. Many non-medical staff have been moved from the Business Center (used to be the old College View Nursing Center) and moved to our Frederick Health Village location. The number of ICU beds have been tripled and the hospital is well prepared to accommodate anyone who needs care. So far there have been over 52 COVID-19 patients who have recovered sufficiently to have been released from the hospital!

Donations from the community (including many volunteers) have been overwhelming, and the hospital truly appreciates it. The staff are so appreciative of all the food, drinks, PPE, face masks and other items that have been arriving daily.

The Auxiliary has been busy as well. The Sewing Committee, chaired by Elsie Warnock, (see photo on page 4) has been very busy at our Frederick Health Village location making face shields, face masks, and recently cutting fabric pattern pieces for themselves and the community to sew. Gowns and face shields are in short supply and the Auxiliary and the community have made more than 1900 face shields and have cut out hundreds of pattern kits (bags of pieces to sew 5 gowns). The hospital is able to reuse the gowns with proper cleaning and disinfecting. If you are able to sew and are interested in having a kit to take home to sew, please contact the Development Office at donate@fmh.org for more information.

This year the Board has decided that instead of paying money toward pledges made prior to the pandemic, we would give our yearly gift to the Frederick Health COVID-19 Employee Relief Fund and Frederick Health COVID-19 Hospital Support Fund (\$37,500 to each fund). One fund helps the hospital offset the costs of the pandemic and the other fund is to help employees who may need financial assistance at this time.

I hope that soon we will be back together as we embark on our 'new normal'. Please stay safe!

Spring has officially arrived in Frederick County! As we practice physical distancing and staying safe at home, I hope you are finding ways to enjoy the warmer weather, spring flowers, and time with loved

There has been a lot of activity over the last month or so, and I would like to give you an update on our continued response to COVID-19.

The incident command team continues to meet daily, tracking operations, supplies, staff and patient needs, and addressing broader issues like financial updates and community needs.

Curbside testing continues at our Toll House location, just across the street from the hospital. We have tested over 3,300 individuals since mid-March, with approximately 600 COVID-19 positive test results. Providing this important service to our community has led to increased awareness of positive cases and quick treatment for those in need; helping to slow or prevent the spread of this virus.

Thanks to the hard work of so many, we remain prepared to treat a potential surge of patients. In the community, we are utilizing our Home Care telemonitoring technology to observe many COVID-19 patients as they recover in the comfort and safety of their own home. At the hospital, we have expanded our ICU and Medical/Surgical bed capacity, cross-trained staff, and relocated patient care areas to improve safety and staff workflows.

This level of response to COVID-19 would not be possible without the support of our volunteers. Thanks to your quick action, we continue to have supplies like masks, face shields, and reusable gowns, which are critical to the health and safety of our frontline staff. Your ongoing dedication to our organization, and the community at large, allows us to continue our mission to positively impact the wellbeing of every individual in our community.

We are all understandably focused on COVID-19, but I urge you to also remain aware of your personal health and well-being. Our hospital and medical group providers are taking all necessary safety precautions to protect patients and staff. I want you to know that it is safe to seek care when you are in need. There is no reason to delay treatment, ignore symptoms, or put off your healthcare concerns for another day.

While we're not yet on the other side of COVID-19, I am confident that by continuing to work together and support one another, we will emerge stronger than ever before. The senior team and I thank you for your commitment to Frederick Health and the community we serve. You make a difference in the lives of so many, and we are grateful to have you as part of our team.

Center down.


And when your body has become still, reach out with your heart.
